

Meeting commenced: 3.10pm Present: Mr Holt, Mrs Copeland, Mr Carter (Governor) 19 students attended the meeting. Year 7 – 7 Year 8 – 5 Year 9 – 4 Year 10 – 3

1. Behaviour for Learning Policy

Mrs Copeland outlined the changes to the behavior policy which is now in place. She explained that this had been achieved through discussion with staff and the School Council at previous meetings. It was agreed by council members that the policy is easier to follow and understand than it was previously and that it should help to remove any confusion – particularly over detentions. Council Reps will feed back to their tutor groups following the meeting.

2. Wellyfest

This whole-school event will take place on the penultimate day of this academic year – Thursday 19th July. The day will be a non-uniform day and lessons will end after period 3. There will be an early lunchtime, following which students will be free to visit a whole host of activities and events around the school site.
