- Mrs L Cooper- Assistant Headteacher i/c of KS3, SEND and Pupil Premium.

Endeavour:

We are working very hard behind the scenes, your Primary schools are passing all kinds of information to us. Yes we get a lot of data, but we also get long pen profiles of your children. Year 6 teachers are outstanding at building vivid pictures of your children. We can't wait to meet them in person! We will be setting some really fun transition work over the summer for your children to try- so they can work hard to get themselves ready for "big school"
