Madrigal

A song, developed in Italy in the 14th century, that is performed without musical instruments and in which several singers sing different notes at the same time. The English Madrigal is sometimes known as a ballett, and 'Now is the month of Maying' is an example of this. It includes refrains which are made up of nonsense syllables such as fa-la-la.
