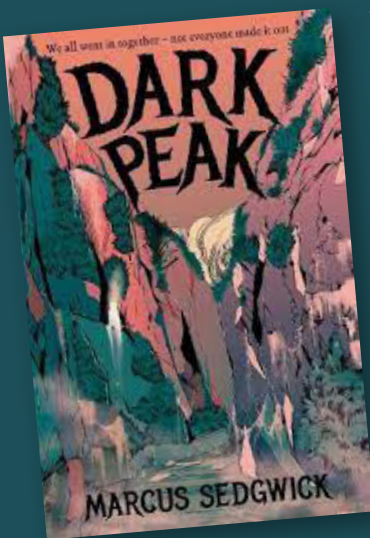
SHORTER READS

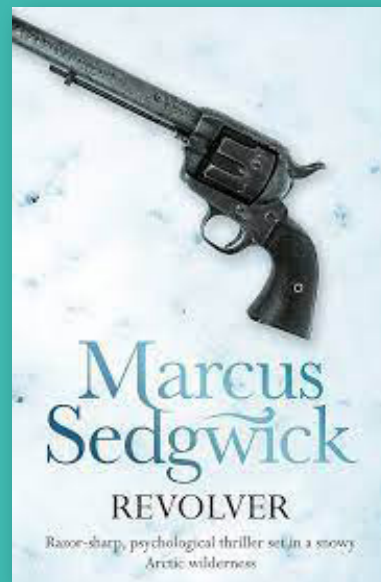
Then Luke learns of the terrible truth of why children are being kidnapped and forced to work in the power station, and he becomes even more desperate to escape.

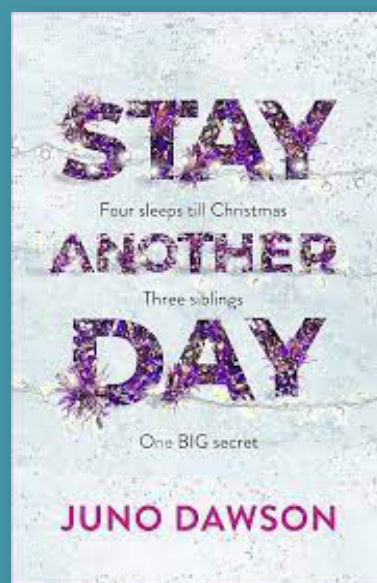


Stay Another Day JUNO DAWSON (13+)

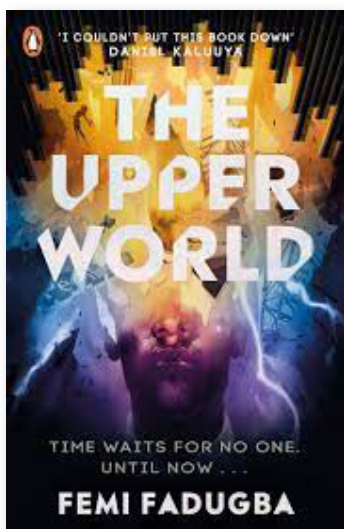

The Upper World

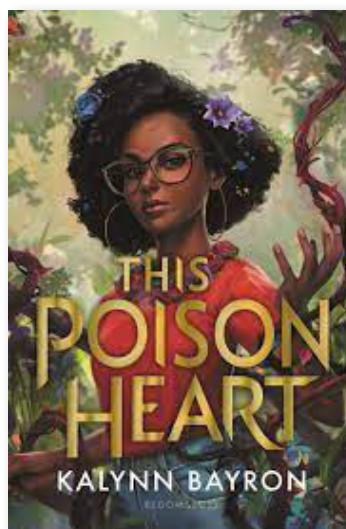
FEMI FADUGBA (13+)

BEN GARROD

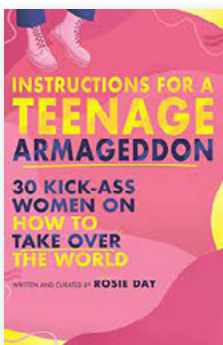

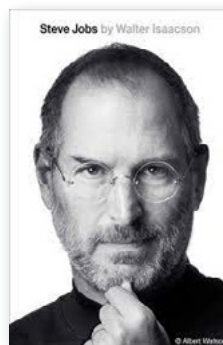
