Why do we have a school uniform?

- To create a sense of pride and identity in our School, which in turn helps to build our community
- Wearing a uniform creates a 'working environment' mindset and helps to separate home and school life
- Uniform removes the points of difference between students, creates a level playing field and helps promote equality
- Uniform promotes wellbeing, improves self-confidence and reduces bullying

Poverty Proofing the School Day

The Governors of Wellington School reserve the right to amend the Behaviour and Appearance Code when deemed necessary.

Wellington School Uniform

- Navy blue blazer with school logo*
- White shirt with long or short sleeves
- School tie
- Navy blue Wellington pleated skirt* Skirts should not be rolled at the waist/ or be altered. Skirts are to be worn just above the knee.
- Navy blue trousers with school logo* Trousers must be worn on the waist
- Plain navy or black tights
- Plain navy, black, grey or white socks
- Smart, plain, all black or all navy suitable shoes (more guidance below)
- Coat or jacket for outdoors (any colour, as they not to be worn in classrooms)
- Predominately black or navy gloves and / or scarf and / or hat
- Plain, all navy or black hair band
- Predominately black or navy coloured School and PE bags

OPTIONAL

- School jumper- (Blazer must be worn over the jumper)
- Hijabs/head scarves must be navy blue or black

*We have logo branded items for consistency and also because they are hardwearing. If any family requires financial assistance with branded uniform, please contact your child's Pastoral Manager.

Hairstyles

- Extreme hairstyles are not permitted e.g. closely shaven heads, patterned hairstyles/eyebrows or unnatural colouring of hair are not acceptable
- The School is the arbiter of what is considered "extreme". If in doubt, contact the School
- Long hair can present a health and safety issue, therefore must be tied back for PE,
 Science and Technology lessons
- Students must wear plain black or navy hair-bands/ bobbles
- No other hair accessories are permitted, apart from beads in braided hair as part of a protective hairstyle – these should be blue/black

Wellington are proud signatories of the Halo Code, which aims to end discrimination for those with afro-textured hair.

Jewellery

- A wristwatch may be worn
- Smart watches are only allowed for telling the time and must **not** be worn when taking examinations. If you use it as a method of communication/recording, it will be confiscated in-line with our mobile phone policy. (See Behaviour policy)
- Students are allowed to wear only one small plain stud in the lowest part of the lower lobe
 of each ear. No other ear piercings are permitted
- Students are not allowed to wear any other jewellery including rings and/or bracelets.
- Students are not allowed to wear any visible body piercings, other than those mentioned above this includes nose studs, tongue studs or any facial piercings
- Clear studs are not allowed. Piercings should be done at the start of the summer holidays to allow time for healing
- Students are not allowed to cover piercings with a plaster
- Unacceptable jewellery will be confiscated.

Makeup

- Make-up should be discreet and subtle, for example light-coverage foundation, to cover blemishes. This should be matched to your skin tone. Eyebrows and eyelashes should look natural.
- Excessive make-up is not allowed e.g. eyeliner/ highlighter/bronzer/lip gloss/heavy coats of mascara. Students will be required to remove.

The School is the arbiter of what is excessive

- False eyelashes are **not allowed** students will be required to remove
- Nail varnish/gels and false nails are **not allowed**. Students will be required to remove.
- Fake tan is not allowed
- Visible tattoos are not allowed
- Lines or shapes cut into eyebrows or hair are not allowed.
- Henna on the hands/arms is permitted at times of religious/cultural celebration e.g. Eid

General presentation

- The top button of shirts must be fastened and the tie must cover the top button.
- Tailored shirts/blouses must not be worn
- Blazer sleeves must not be rolled
- Students are expected to wear their shirts tucked into trousers / skirts
- School ties must be worn to an acceptable length (6 button rule)
- Students must not write on their hands/legs
- Only plain white T shirt vests/underwear may be worn under school shirts; these must not be visible at the collar of the shirt. Students wearing coloured T-shirts will be asked to remove them
- The school blazer is compulsory for all students and must be worn at all times unless permission is given to remove e.g. for practical lessons and in hot weather
- The school jumper must not be tucked into waistbands
- Outdoor coats / jackets / outdoor scarves/ gloves/ hoods must not be worn in classrooms
- Hoods (of coats) must not be worn up inside any building
- Coats cannot be worn underneath blazers
- Sweatshirts or hooded tops of any description are not permitted around the site and will be confiscated
- Hats/caps are not allowed (unless permission is granted for medical reasons)
- In addition to badges given out by school, we do allow wearing of small pin-badges on blazers to show support for things you are passionate about, for example, a small Pride flag. Badges that may cause offence or unnecessary controversy, will need to be removed e.g. bad language

Bags

- Bags must be predominately black or navy and large enough to carry books and/or equipment to and from school. This includes P.E bags.
- Students will be asked to replace unsuitable bags
- Students may not wear backpacks and other bags in the classroom; these should be removed and placed on the floor

Footwear

- Sensible, plain, all black or navy black or navy **shoes** should be worn for school
- No Sports trainers (even if sold in school-wear sections) and ankle boots are allowed
- Students who arrive into school wearing sports trainers or other unsuitable footwear (without good reason) will be put in Room 41 at lunchtime

P.E. Kit

- White 'T' Shirt with logo
- Navy shorts or skort with logo
- White sports socks and football socks with logo
- We strongly advise the wearing of shin pads for hockey and football
- Football boots
- We strongly advise the wearing of gumshields for hockey and rugby
- Plain navy tracksuit bottoms for colder weather
- Plain navy sports leggings
- All students must be equipped with footwear suitable for sporting activity
- 'Fashion' trainers / pumps are not suitable for PE / games
- Students excused from PE with a note must bring suitable kit to allow them to participate as officials / sports leaders
- Navy fleece with logo (Girls)
- Reversible navy / green rugby shirt with logo (Boys)

If you do not bring your PE kit to lessons, you will be expected to borrow spare kit and still take part

Additional

- Students are expected to take personal responsibility for their belongings. The school cannot take responsibility for personal items that are lost.
- All items of clothing should be named /marked. Unnamed / unmarked items will be put into lost property
- Students should also "look the part" in terms of bringing the right equipment to school. All students should have a pen (and a spare), a pencil, a ruler, an eraser and a calculator in a pencil case. School are happy to supply these as part of our commitment to povertyproofing the school day. Please alert your child's Pastoral Manager if you require assistance.
